Desired Data

- Number of people entering homelessness for the first time.
- Would like to know who is falling into homelessness, who is escaping it, what's working, and do more of that.
- Basic Demographic Info and correlated demographic information.
- Times homeless and duration of homelessness.
- How many total households in Pierce County.
- Data from hospitals on unsheltered visits.
- Why homeless (DV, Criminal background, credit score. Under-employed.).
- How many total living units are in Pierce County (Homes, apt, shelters, transitional units).
- More transparency on data sets for people experiencing homelessness, for example causes of death/ number of people dying.

General Comments

- HMIS might be antiquated at this point.
- I'd like to see HMIS access improved.
- Data is vital for planning long term.
- It's important to look at who is having a difficult time escaping homelessness and why this is where we need to focus resources.
- Public information collected is paid for and should be accessible to members of the public.
- HMIS is an important source of data, but having good training in conducting queries is vital. It's also important to have good training for the folks who are doing coordinated entry.
- Have a unified system of data; a "one stop shop" for data gathering and understanding the limitations of this data.
- Data should be collected to improve services; not just because it's always been collected.
- Street deaths are a consequence of cumulative unresolved trauma.
