What kind of medical needs are you seeing when you do outreach?

What are we seeing?

- See a lot of folks who don't know who primary care provider is. Most primary care clinics aren't receiving new patients, so if they have an urgent issue, they end up in the ER.
- See dental problems, skin infections, injuries.
- Many folks need foot care. See folks who are relatively young and losing feet to diabetes. Another person lost foot in a fire.
- Extremities are always an impact feet, hands, teeth, especially in extreme weather.
- Recently took a young man to a clinic with multiple needs, but only one thing was addressed. It was too short of a visit. He ended up needing surgery.
- Free clinics are reporting increasing numbers of people who are unhoused.
- "As a community member living on eastside near Salishan the violence I see towards homeless folks is terrible. I offer what I can to provide some support when altercations happen."
- People in the hot weather without sunscreen and sunglasses—simple but try to give out sunscreen and sunglasses also providing dry socks for their feet.

Barriers to care

- See many people having a difficult time ambulating due to lost limbs.
- Substance use disorder and mental health issues also impact ability to seek care.
- Inability to maintain hygiene also contributes to illness infections. Need more mobile showers with medical care. Need rest stops all over the county for folks with bathrooms, trash.
- Important to acknowledge the problems with pets that may require some care that people can't afford.
- Need better awareness of the services that currently exist.

Misc. observations

- During winter, presence of the needle exchange and MRC on G street is essential.
- Work with folks planning education which is hard to do if unhoused...
- Having people on the street in wheelchairs and missing limbs sleeping outside in these
 devices demonstrates evidence of the morbidity. All of this can bring despair at being
 able to respond positively.
- Have found that joining a church working on assisting homeless folks brings sense of common effort.
- How do we detemine coalition support for broader, long-term solutions re: healthcare and medical debt, namely single-payer healthcare?
